### **Academic Policies Related to Scheduling & Course Selection**

1. Advanced Diploma candidates should consider taking their “additional core” class as a third year of World Languages to fulfill admission requirements at some colleges. Core classes are considered to be Math, English, Science, Social Science and World Languages.
2. Students may receive one full PE credit through participation in two seasons of an OSAA-sanctioned sports team at Westside or at your public school. Students will receive a grade of P, rather than A through F for this credit. Students do not have to earn the entire credit in the same school year. If a student takes a regular PE class in the future, the credit earned through sports participation will be removed from their transcript.
3. Students may take one credit in an online or correspondence format during their enrollment at Westside but this course may not be a “Core” class (English, Math, Science, Social Science, or World Language) without an appeal to the Head of School.
4. Students are required to have a full schedule of 7 classes each year until their senior year when they may reduce their load to as few as 5 classes.
